



## **Treasure Vault of Seth**

### **Where?**

Deep under the ground where the burning Egyptian sun bakes the surface by day and the cold still air cools it by night, a vault containing treasure of immeasurable value lies hidden since its concealment over four thousand years ago.

Edgar Cayce, one of the world's leading psychics once referred to this sacred place of antiquity as being in the location or immediate vicinity of the Great Pyramid and its mysterious companion the Sphinx!

He defined its location in these words:

"This in position lies, as the sun rises from the waters, the line of the shadow falls between the paws of the Sphinx, that was later set as the sentinel or guard, and which may not be entered from the connecting chambers from the Sphinx's paw until the time has been fulfilled when the changes must be active in the sphere of man's experience. Between, then, the Sphinx and the river."

But this was not all. In 1975 his son Hugh Lynn Cayce and a group of friends including a Canadian 'sensitive' George McMullen, decided to check out some of these observations.

After examining the numerous pieces of evidence, McMullen was able to complete more fully the information concerning the whereabouts of this intriguing treasure chamber. He stated that it could be located "on a day in late October as the sun sets, the shadow cast by the Cheops Pyramid and by the head of the Sphinx will overlap, merge, and coincide at a single point on the flat pavement-like plaza area in the direction of the Nile"

But is this all there is to its location? If so, it would no doubt have been discovered centuries ago. However, it was not. This leads us to the inevitable conclusion that there is still more to consider!

First, let's go back in time and recall the words of the Egyptian priest Sonchis of Sais who when speaking to Solon the Greek lawgiver said:

"You are all young in your souls; for you have not any old tradition, any ancient belief or knowledge that is hoary with age. And the reason of it is this: many have been the destructions of mankind, and many shall be."

From this statement it is evident that the Egyptians had records going back at least a millennium beyond Greek history. But they were not the only ones. The 4,000-year-old *Epic of Gilgamesh* says that Gilgamesh "was wise, he saw mysteries and knew secret things, he brought us a tale of the days before the flood. He went on a long journey, was weary, worn-out with labour, and returning engraved on a stone the whole story."

The Pyramids of Babylon, or ziggurats, named due to a peculiar characteristic of their own, were tiered towers constructed over or near hidden vaults sheltering the records of mankind spanning vast periods of time, so the Babylonian priests claimed.

But let us leave the Babylonians for now and come back to Egypt. A priest and keeper of the sacred archives of the temple of Heliopolis in the third Century before the common era, extracted his story of the past from pillars in secret subterranean temples of Egypt near Thebes, not far from the sounding statue of Memnon.

It seems that the inscription on these columns were made by Thoth, (Seth?). After the deluge these records were translated (due to the confusion of tongues at Babel?) and transcribed on scrolls by Agatodaemon (Japheth?), a descendant of Thoth, and then deposited in unknown temple vaults.

When writing about the Pyramids, the Roman historian Ammianus Marcellinus adds his testimony to the reality of these vaults with chronicles concealed in Egypt. He states:

"There are also subterranean passages and winding retreats, which, it is said, men skilful in the ancient mysteries, by means of which they divined the coming of a flood, constructed in different places lest the memory of all their sacred ceremonies should be lost."

The writings of the ancients are silent as to the exact location of these retreats. Is the Khufu Pyramid a key to the location of a secret treasury of a once-superior antediluvian culture? Yet while this question may seem ludicrous, Manetho, the priest of Heliopolis who extracted this history of the past from those subterranean pillars, maintained that the Great Pyramid had never been erected by the Egyptians.

When Herodotus paid a visit to Egypt in 455 B.C.E. he firmly established that the megalithic structure definitely contained nothing whatsoever resembling burial remains.

So then, considering the picture so far, the probability of secret chambers in or under the Great Pyramid or Sphinx, or even within the near vicinity, should no longer remain just in the realm of speculation. It is only when theory is converted into practice that discoveries are made.

Also, is there perhaps any additional evidence which one might take into consideration? It has already been suggested here that Thoth the Egyptian god of wisdom, identified with the Greek, Hermes, and the Roman, Mercury, was none-other than Seth the second antediluvian patriarch and third son of Adam.

Incredulous as this might seem, two surviving manuscripts both of independent origin have helped to clarify this point. The first, a surviving Coptic text by Masaudi, a Coptic writer of the Middle Ages, states in part:

"Surid... one of the Kings of Egypt before the flood... built two great pyramids... He also ordered the priests to deposit therein the total of their wisdom and their knowledge of the different arts and sciences of mathematics and geometry so that they would be as a witness for the benefit of those who could eventually understand them..."

Surid? King of Egypt? Before the Flood? Theocratic scholars are already more than familiar with this particular period and are well aware that during this time before the Flood, all the earth was of *one language* and *one people*. There were no separate nations or colours as we have today. These came after the Flood.

So perhaps the original text from which the Coptic writer copied his information read something like this:

"Seth, son of Adam... one of the Patriarchs of Adlan before the Flood... built two great pyramids."

But one might still ask if we can qualify this explanation?

Well, this is where the second manuscript comes in. Searching one day through the writings of the Jewish Historian Flavius Josephus, a curious passage came to light.

In his lengthy document 'Antiquities of the Jews' Book 1, Chapter 2, Paragraph 3, we read:

"...Now this Seth, when he was brought up, and came to those years in which he could discern what was good, he became a virtuous man, and, as he was himself of an excellent character, so did he leave children behind him who imitated his virtues... And, that their inventions might not be lost before they were sufficiently known, upon Adam's prediction that the world was to be destroyed at one time by the force of *fire*, and at another time by the violence and quantity of *water*, they made two pillars, the one of brick, the other of stone; they inscribed their discoveries on them both, that in case the pillar of brick should be destroyed by the flood, the pillar of stone might remain, and exhibit those discoveries to mankind, and also inform them that there was another pillar of brick erected by them. Now this remains in the land of Syriad to this day."

Well, this statement in itself really clinched the issue. The Great Pyramid erected on the instructions of Seth, does still stand in the land of Syriad (Egypt) even now in the Twentieth Century. Unfortunately however, its white marble casing stones on which it is said the letters and symbols expressing the entire knowledge of antiquity are engraved, have long since been removed and used in the building of palaces and other places of grandeur which now form Cairo.

So with the scattering of this first once complete piece of literary evidence, a treasure in itself, we must turn our attention once more to seeking the location of Seth's hidden vault. But how does one go about looking for such an obscure place of antiquity?

Where there is something of value, one would expect to find a guardian or protector, and sure enough, here too is no exception. For resting by the pyramids like a watchdog, is the Sphinx of Gizeh. The peculiar type of uraeus on the head of the Sphinx suggests a very early perhaps even pre-Flood sculpture.

Many have stood before the Sphinx and meditated on the age and purpose of this wonder of antiquity. The ancient Egyptians called it 'Hu' or protector, while from earliest times it was believed that a secret chamber existed under the Sphinx. Does 'Hu' guard a pre-deluge treasure vault with records?

Certainly speculation grows when we discover that only about a thousand years ago, the Arabs wrote of moving in the pyramid galleries and secret doors which moved by an unknown force. There are even accounts concerning robots guarding treasure and flashes of brilliant light in the depths of the pyramids.

Scientists who have tried to X-ray the Pyramid of Chephren, found that their modern electronic equipment was so affected by the source of this unexplained phenomena, their readings were thrown into utter confusion. Even when cosmic ray measuring equipment was installed in the chamber at the base line of Chephren's pyramid, the recordings were so abnormal that Dr. Amr Gohed, the Arab scientist in charge of the installation said "*It defies all the known laws of science and electronics.*" In fact he went on to say "*This is scientifically impossible.*"

Impossible, and yet it happened! So where does this force-field come from? More important still, could the superior science and technology which created it be found among the records hidden in the so-far undiscovered Treasure Vault of Seth?

It seems reasonable to suppose that where the shadows cast by both the Great Pyramid and the Sphinx meet, "As the sun rises from the waters... ". This would be the exact spot where the Treasure of Wealth and Knowledge including man's complete history from the dawn of time could be found!

But are we really that naïve? Surely if this is all there was to it, someone would already have discovered it and all its secrets would now be revealed. But the truth of the matter is that many have sought, yet all have come up empty handed!

So why is this? Well, to pinpoint the exact location of Seth's Vault, three things must be taken into consideration.

- (1) The crystal *pyramidion* which once formed the apex of the now missing marble capstone of this truncated wonder, would need to be replaced along with its companion, thus bringing the vast edifice to its normal height.
- (2) The *crown* which we now know once rested on the head of the Sphinx, must also be replaced, although it has never yet been determined as to its size and height.
- (3) Due to recent surveys, it has been discovered that the Great Pyramid has moved its position over the past four millennium and is now resting three miles south of its original location.

It does not take a great mathematician to work out that only when these features are replaced or rectified (as in the case of the Great Pyramid's location), will the combined shadows of these two monuments of antiquity once more pinpoint the precise location of Seth's Treasure Vault.

Until then, the whole of mankind must wait and hope!
